| Older Coloradans | A few Colorado higher education institutions offer programs for older adults to audit classes for free. At Colorado State University , you have to be age 55 or older to qualify. At the University of Colorado Denver and the Metropolitan State University of Denver , you have to be at least 60 years old. And at the University of Northern Colorado , the minimum age is 65. At Colorado State University Pueblo , you either have to be 62 to 64 and retired or 65 or older. The University of Denver offers a senior audit program for adults 60-plus for \$100 per course. |
