<p>Colorado Department of Education (CDE) Adult Education programs</p>	<p>Adult Education programs across the state within community colleges and community-based organizations are made possible by federal and state funding administered through the Colorado Department of Education. These programs include GED/High School Equivalency and English Language Acquisition opportunities. Test preparation classes are often low or no cost with the tests costing about \$150. More information, a map and directory of Adult Education providers can be found here.</p> <p>Adult Basic Education is not just for those who want to complete their GED/High School Equivalency — these classes are available to anyone who would like to refresh or improve their basic skills.</p> <p>Other Adult Education opportunities through CDE include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Integrated Education and Training (IET) a program that allows learners to take basic skills and/or English classes at the same time as they study for occupational certificates. A learner can earn both a High School Equivalency while working on a college or occupational certificate. ● Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) a comprehensive program that teaches English language learners how to achieve competence in reading, writing, speaking and comprehension that leads to meaningful work and careers. ● Workplace Adult Education and Literacy is offered through employers who wish to support their employees to improve basic skills of their employees.
