<p>Reskilling Upskilling and Next-skilling (RUN) funds through the Ready to Rise Website or by visiting the local workforce center websites or physically visiting a local workforce center - Directory of workforce centers</p>	<p>Reskilling, upskilling, and next-skilling (RUN) funds were allocated to local workforce boards under HB21-1264. Anyone 16 or older who is unemployed, underemployed, economically impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, or previously incarcerated may qualify. Colorado’s local workforce centers have stimulus funds to provide training to support individual’s next career move. Whether they want to find a new job, advance their skills, or change careers, funding is available to help them on their way to an in-demand, well-paying job.</p> <p>Please be sure to check with your local workforce center using the directory to the left to see if funding is available in your region.</p>
<p>Registered Apprenticeship programs available through Colorado Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE)</p>	<p>Colorado has been a national leader in expanding apprenticeship opportunities and integrating them into existing systems. In addition to the extensive registered apprenticeship programs listed in the CDLE directory, the Colorado Department of Higher Education and Colorado Community College System have federal grants to dramatically expand the number of Health Care Apprenticeships and IT Apprenticeships across Colorado. These programs are accessible through local community programs, and local workforce boards have similar programs.</p>
